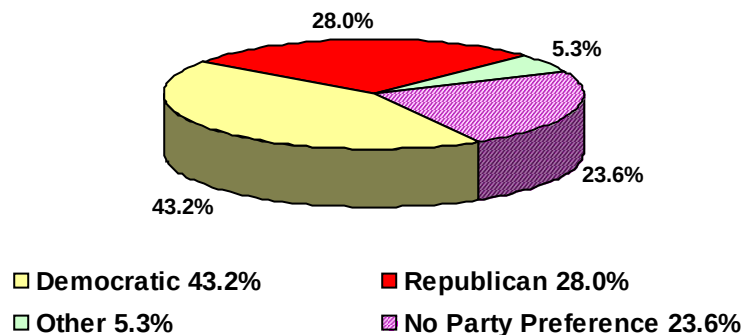

TRENDS

Since the last Odd-Numbered Year Report of Registration (February 10, 2013):

- The total voter registration in the state decreased from 18,055,783 to 17,717,936.
- The percentage of the total number of registered voters compared to the number of people who are eligible to register to vote decreased from 75.7% to 72.7%.
- The percentage of voters who have no party preference increased from 20.9% to 23.6%.
- The percentage of people registered with a qualified political party decreased from 77.1% to 75.6%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Democratic Party decreased from 43.9% to 43.2%.
- The percentage of voters registered with the Republican Party decreased from 28.9% to 28%.
